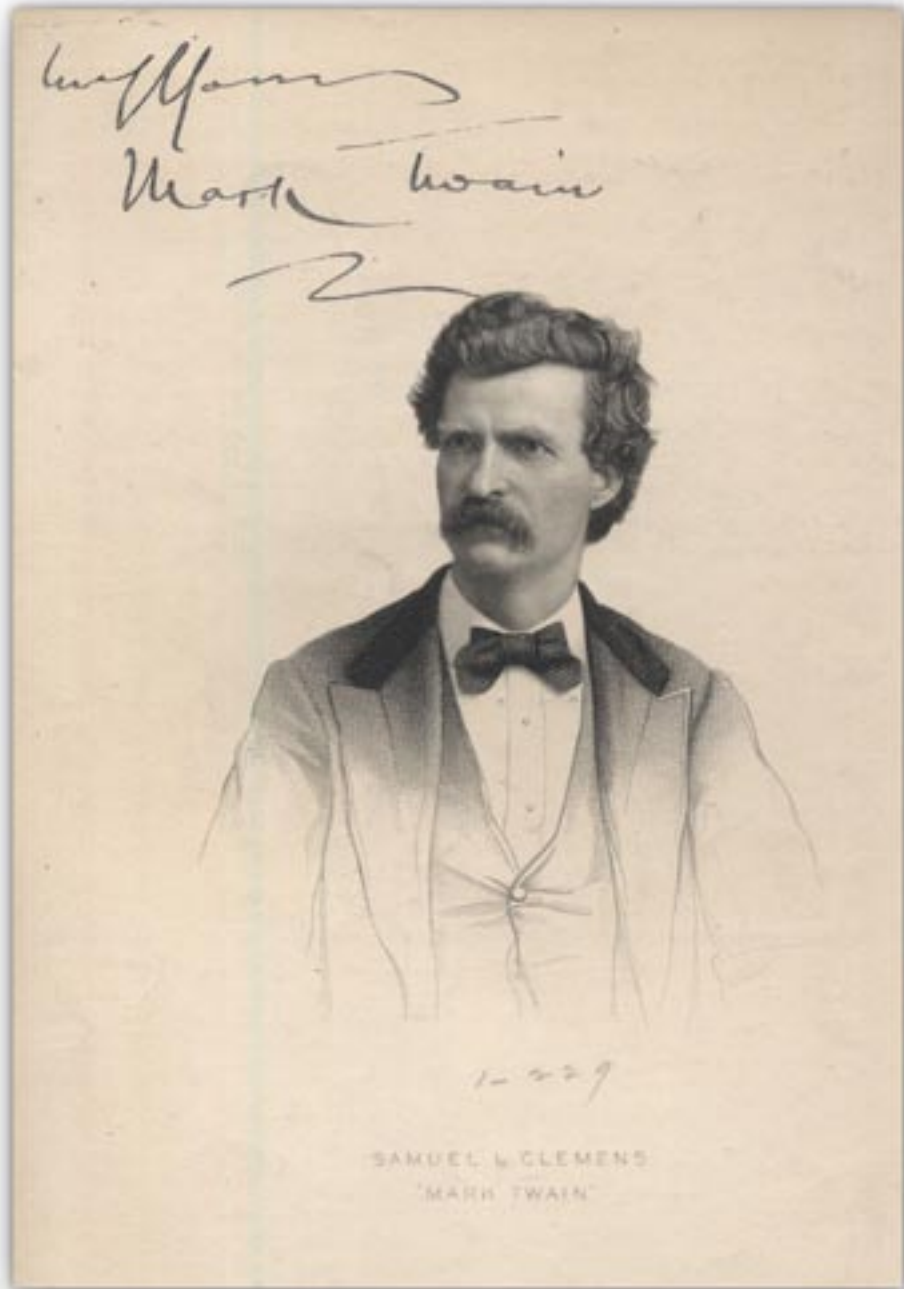

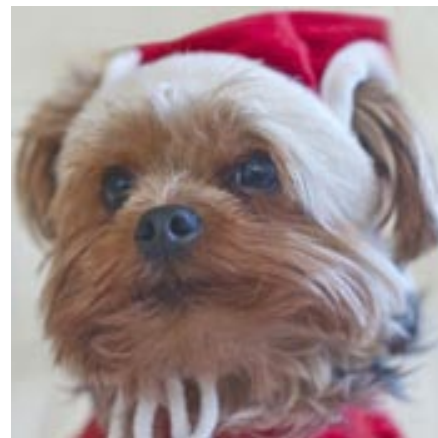

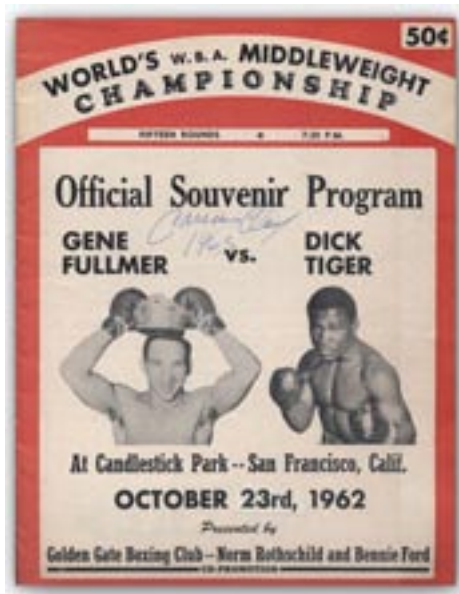


1. Jessica Alba. (Born 1981). American television and film actress. She rose to prominence as the lead actress in the television series Dark

Angel (2000–2002). Alba later appeared in

various films including Honey (2003), Sin City (2005), Fantastic Four (2005), Into the Blue (2005), Fantastic Four: Rise of the Silver Surfer and Good Luck Chuck both in 2007. 8x10 color photo signed in silver pen. Very slight rubbing to the silver ink.

2. Muhammad Ali. (Born 1942). American heavyweight world champion, known outside the ring for poetry and outspoken political views. He retired from the ring in 1979. Originally known as Cassius Clay, Ali changed his name after joining the Nation of Islam in 1964, subsequently converting to Sunni Islam in 1975, and more recently practicing Sufism. In 1967, three years after Ali had won the World Heavyweight Championship, he was publicly vilified for his refusal to be conscripted into the U.S. military, based on his religious beliefs and opposition to the Vietnam War. 9x12 official souvenir program from the World's WBA Middleweight Championship, Gene Fullmer vs. Dick Tiger, October 23rd, 1962, held at Candlestick Park in San Francisco. Signed on cover in blue ink, "Cassius Clay 1963." Light age toning. Any vintage Cassius Clay autograph is extremely rare and desired.

3. Authors: P. D. James, Colleen McCullough, Ursula LeGuin and Tess Gerritsen. James. (Born 1920). English crime writer and Conservative life peer in the House of Lords, most famous for a series of detective novels starring policeman and poet Adam Dalgliesh. McCullough. (Born 1937). Internationally acclaimed Australian author. Author of the Thorn Birds, The First Man in Rome, The Grass Crown and Antony and Cleopatra. LeGuinn. (Born 1929). American author. She has written novels, poetry, children's books, essays, and short stories, notably in fantasy and science fiction. Best known for her Earth Sea fantasy novels. Gerritsen. (Born 1953). Chinese-American novelist and retired physician. Best known for her medical thrillers, including Harvest, The Surgeon, and The Bone Garden. 6.5x3.5 FDC honoring Edith Wharton, postmarked 1980 signed in ink by all four women authors. 4. Edgar Bergen. (1903-1978). American ventriloquist. Enormously popular in 1930s and 1940s radio for his skits involving his dummy sidekick, Charlie McCarthy. 4.5x3.5 album sheet, signed in blue ink, "Best Regards from Edgar Bergen and Charlie." Collector's pencil notes along upper margin, affecting first words of signature.

5. Sandra Bernhard. (Born 1955). American comedian, actress, singer, model, satirist and exhibitionist. 8x10 color close-up photo signed in black felt pen. In very good condition. Includes COA from R&R Enterprises.

6. Richard I. Bong. (1920-1945). America's "Ace of Aces." Flying the P-38 Lightning in the Pacific theater Major Richard Bong was the top scoring U. S. Ace during WWII with 40 kills. After he got married he returned to California where he became a test pilot for the Army Air Force jets. From July 7th to August 6th, 1945 he made 11 test flights. On August 6, 1945 (the day the Enola Gay dropped an atomic bomb on Hiroshima) Dick Bong was killed when

the P-80 he was testing stalled on takeoff and he bailed out at low altitude. 5.5x3.5 48-star American flag, signed in black ink. A very rare signature. Light soiling, few stray ink marks away from signature.

7. Ernest Borgnine. (Born 1917). Forceful American character actor. He is best known for his good-guy roles in two television favorites, the wartime comedy McHale's Navy (1962-66) and the adventure drama Airwolf (1984-86). 7.5x9.75 black and white Volpe reproduction drawing signed in black Sharpie. In very good condition. Minor toning along edges.

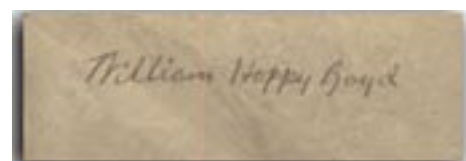

8. Boston Legal. William Shatner. (Born 1931). Canadian leading actor, writer and director. Best known for playing Captain Kirk in Star Trek. **James Spader.** (Born 1960). American actor best known for his eccentric roles in movies such as Sex, Lies, and Videotape, Star-

gate, and Secretary. **Candice Bergen.** (Born 1946). American actress. Academy Award nominee for Starting Over, and star of TVs Murphy Brown. **Rene Auberjonois.** (Born 1940). American actor best known for his early 1980s role as Clayton Endicott III on the television show Benson and his role as Odo on Star Trek: Deep Space Nine. **Mark Valley.** (Born 1964). American film and television actor, known for his role as Brad Chase on the TV drama Boston Legal and Christopher Chance in Fox's action/drama Human Target. **Julie Bowen.** (Born 1970). American film and television actress. She played Carol Vessey on Ed and Denise Bauer on Boston Legal. She is best known for playing Claire Dunphy on the sitcom Modern Family, for which she won the Primetime Emmy Award for Outstanding Supporting Actress in a Comedy Series in 2011. 10x8 color photo of the cast, signed in black ink by all. 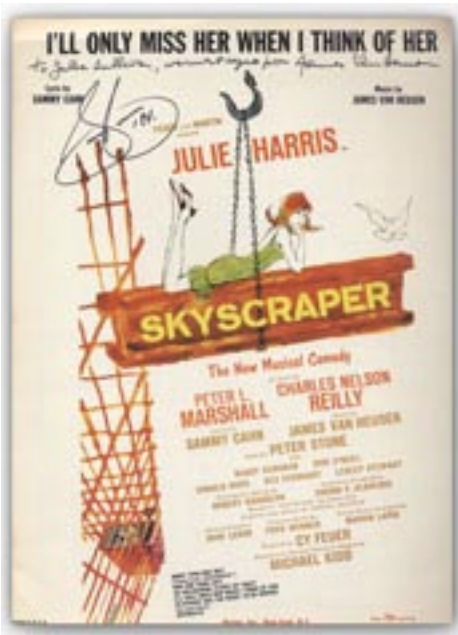

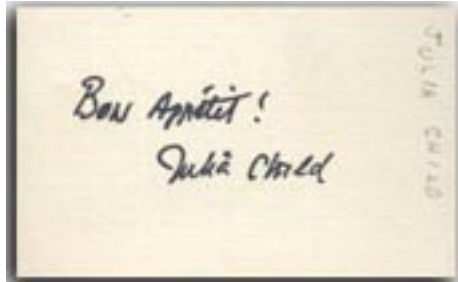

12. Sammy Cahn and James Van Heusen. Cahn. (1913-1993). American lyricist who wrote many film songs, usually with James Van Heusen. Won Oscars for four songs: *Three Coins in the Fountain*, *High Hopes*, *All the Way*, and *Call Me Irresponsible*. Van Heusen. (1913-1990). American composer. He wrote songs mainly for films and television (but also for the theater), and won an Emmy and four Acad-

emy Awards for Best Original Song. 9x12 sheet music for "I'll Only Miss Her When I Think of Her" from the musical comedy *Skyscraper*. Signed and inscribed in black ink by Van Heusen, and signed in black ink by Cahn. Light creasing along upper margin.

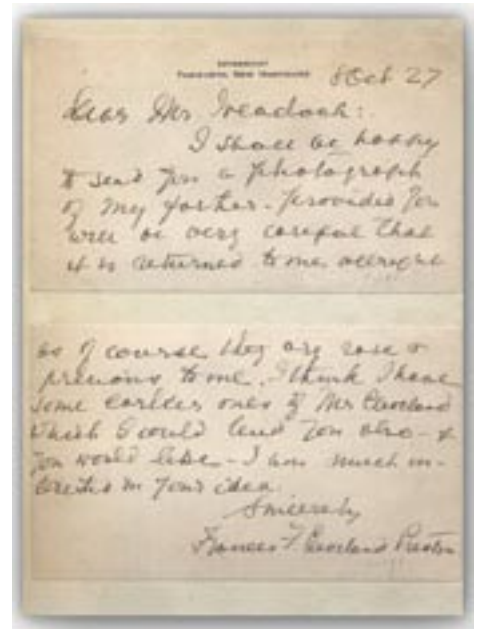
13. Julia Child. (1912-2004). American cooking expert, TV chef and cookbook author who revolutionized the way Americans cook. A little known fact, she worked as an American spy during WWII. 4x2.5 card signed in black Sharpie, "Bon Appetit! Julia Child." In very good condition.

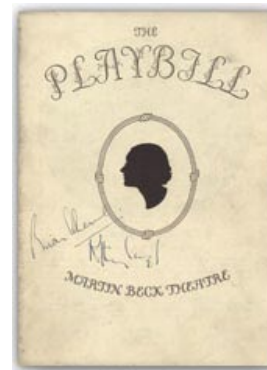
14. Robert Clarke. (1920-2005). Actor, director and producer. Clarke worked in Hollywood from 1944 until 1965. He appeared in all genres: horror, science fiction, Westerns and dramas. He worked with John Wayne, Bela Lugosi, Boris Karloff and Clark Gable. He made his directorial debut with *The Hideous Sun Demon* (1959). 8x10 black and white photo as the hideous Sun Demon, signed in black ink. In very good condition.

15. Frances Cleveland. (1864-1947). First lady, wife of Grover Cleveland. President Grover Cleveland was still a bachelor when he entered the White House, so Cleveland's marriage on June 2, 1886, to Frances Folsom, daughter of his former law partner, was sensational news to friend and foe alike. ALS on two 5.5x3 sheets with letterhead from Cleveland's New Hampshire vacation home, Intermont, mounted to larger sheet, 8 October, 1927. In part, "I shall be happy to send you a photograph of my father.... I think I have some earlier ones of Mr Cleveland which I could lend you also.... I am much interested in your idea. Sincerely, Frances F. Cleveland Preston." Includes printed portrait of Mrs. Cleveland, commissioned by a former American Minister to China. Light overall surface soiling, collector's pencil notes in lower portion of each sheet.

16. Katharine Cornell and Brian Aherne. Cornell. (1893-1974). Renowned stage actress whose illustrious career spanned five decades. At the age of 58,

she recreated the role of Elizabeth Barrett in *The Barretts of Wimpole Street* on live

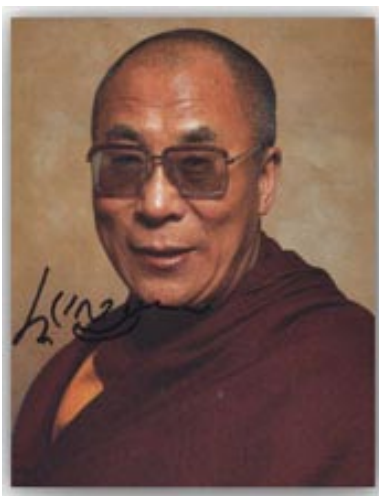
television in 1956, twenty-five years after she first played it in the original 1931 Broadway production. She won Broadway's 1948 Tony Award as Best Actress. Aherne. (1902-1986). British actor of both stage and screen, who found success in Hollywood. Original 7x9.5 playbill from the 1935 production of *The Barretts of Wimpole Street* at the Martin Beck Theatre. Signed by Cornell and Aherne in blue ink on cover. Original ticket stub affixed to cast page. Soiling to cover.

17. Katharine Cornell and Kirk Douglas. Douglas. (Born 1916). American stage and film actor, film producer and author. Original 7x9.5 playbill from the 1942 production of *The Three Sisters* at the Ethel Barrymore Theatre. Signed in black ink on first cast page by Cornell and on second cast page by Douglas. A very early Douglas signature. Light age toning, cover ripped along spine.

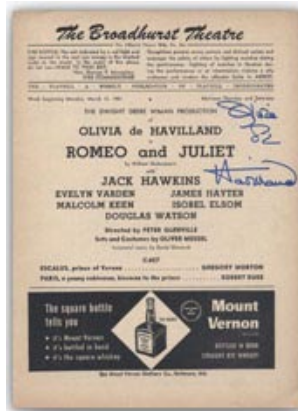

18. Dalai Lama. (Born 1935). The 14th in the line of Dalai Lamas, Bstan-'dzin-rgya-mtsho, was born in 1935 in Tsinghai province, China, of Tibetan parentage. He was enthroned in 1940 but fled

to exile in India with a group of 100,000 followers in 1959, the year of the Tibetan people's unsuccessful revolt against communist Chinese forces that had occupied the country since 1950. In 1989 he was awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in recognition of his nonviolent campaign to end Chinese domination of Tibet. 4x5 color photo of the Dalai Lama signed in Tibetan in black Sharpie. 19. Olivia de Havilland. (Born 1916). Multi-Award winning actress remembered for her portrayal of Melanie in *Gone With The Wind*. Original 6.5x9 playbill from the 1951 production of *Romeo and Juliet* at the Broadhurst Theatre. Signed in blue ink on cast page. Light age toning, some pages separated.

20. Laura Dern. (Born 1967). American actress, film director and producer. Dern has acted in such films as *Smooth Talk* (1985), *Blue Velvet* (1986), *Fat Man and Little Boy* (1988), *Wild at Heart* (1990), *Jurassic Park* (1993) and *October Sky* (1999). She has won awards for her performance

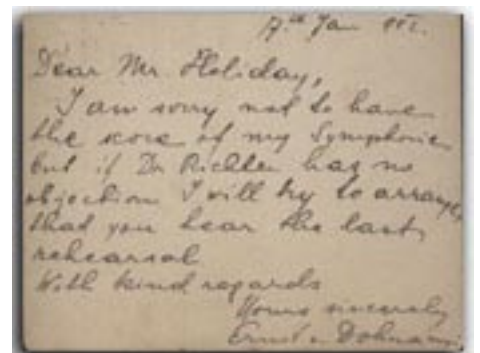

21. Joe DiMaggio. (1914-1999). Husband of Marilyn Monroe and baseball hall of famer. Connie Mack called him "The greatest team player of all time." A graceful outfielder who made it look easy, he was a consistent hitter and a favorite with the fans. DiMaggio was second only to Ruth as Yankee hero and record-holder. In-person blue ink signature on sweet spot of official American League baseball. Includes original Ball Only Ticket for \$150 for the Yankee Show of Legends, Taj Mahal Casino, May 7, 1995. Sealed in plastic (can be removed). Scattered age toning, including signature area. Rare in signed baseballs.

22. Erno Dohnányi. (1877-1960). Hungarian conductor, composer, and pianist. Using his position as a conductor, Dohnányi pioneered the performance of Bartók's more accessible music to boost its popularity. Unlike most other famous pianists of the time, Dohnányi did not limit

himself to solo recitals and concerto solos, but also played chamber music. ALS in English on 4.5x3.5 postcard, January 17, 1902. In full, "Dear Mr. Holiday: I am sorry not to have the score of my Symphonie [sic], but if Dr. Richter has no objection I will try to arrange that you heard the last rehearsal." Minor age toning, otherwise very good. Includes invoice showing the cost at \$185.

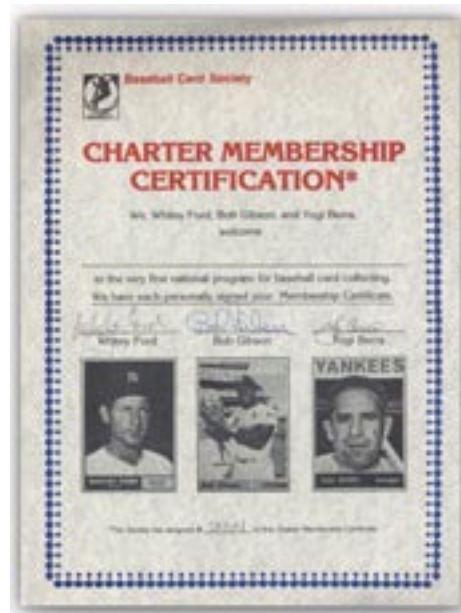
23. Doolittle Raiders. 8x10.5 official Doolittle Raiders letterhead, signed by 19 raiders (15 of them deceased) at the 55th Reunion in Las Vegas, between April 22-25, 1997. Framed for overall size of 10.75x13.25. Signed in various shades of ink by: **Bill Bower, Edwin Horton, Jack A. Sims, J. R. Stork, Frank Keppeler, Jacob DeShazer, Nolan Herndon, David Jones, Hank Potter** (signed twice), **Joseph Manske, Chase Jay Nielson, Travis Hoover, Charles C. McClure, Everett W. Holstrom**, plus four of the only five surviving Raiders: **Richard Cole, Thomas Griffin, Edward Saylor, and David Thatcher.** Collector's pencil notes in lower right corner.

24. Sarah Ferguson. Born 1959). British charity patron, spokesperson, writer, film producer, television personality and former member of the British Royal Family and former spoke person for Weight Watchers. She is the former wife of Prince Andrew, Duke of York. In May 2010, Sarah was filmed by News of the World offering access to Prince Andrew for £500,000 by Mazher Mahmood, an undercover reporter posing as an Indian businessman. 8x10 color photo of Fergie holding an apple for an ad for Weight Watchers. In very good condition.

25. Whitey Ford, Yogi Berra, and Bob Gibson. Ford. (Born 1926). New York Yankee Hall of Famer. During his ca-

reer, he collected 236 wins and 106 losses, and eleven World Series appearances as a Yankee. Berra. (Born 1925). Baseball player and coach. Catcher with the New York Yankees for 17 years. Manager and coach for Yankees, New York Mets, and Houston Astros. Gibson. Born 1935). One of the most dominating pitchers in baseball history. He was known for his fast ball, his control, and his intense concentration on the mound. Gibson played his entire major league career with the St. Louis Cardinals of the National League. He became the second pitcher in baseball history to strike out 3,000 batters. Gibson was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1981. 8.5x11 signed Baseball Card Society Charter Member Certification invitation to the first national program for baseball card collecting. Signed in both black and blue ink. Number 2444. In very good condition. Faint crease at top.

26. Jodie Foster. (Born 1963). American actress and two-time Academy Award winner. Extremely versatile precocious child star who made the transition to adult roles. 8x10 color photo of a young Foster staring right at the camera signed in blue felt pen. In very good condition.

27. Gina Gershon. (Born 1962). American actress. She made her feature film debut playing a small role opposite Molly Ringwald in 1986's *Pretty in Pink*, and graduated to the juicier role of Coral opposite Tom Cruise in *Cocktail* (1988). Gershon is well known for having a large and dedicated gay and lesbian following, probably influenced in part by her lesbian/bisexual roles in such movies as *Bound* and *Showgirls*. 8x10 color photo showing her ample cleavage signed in blue felt pen. 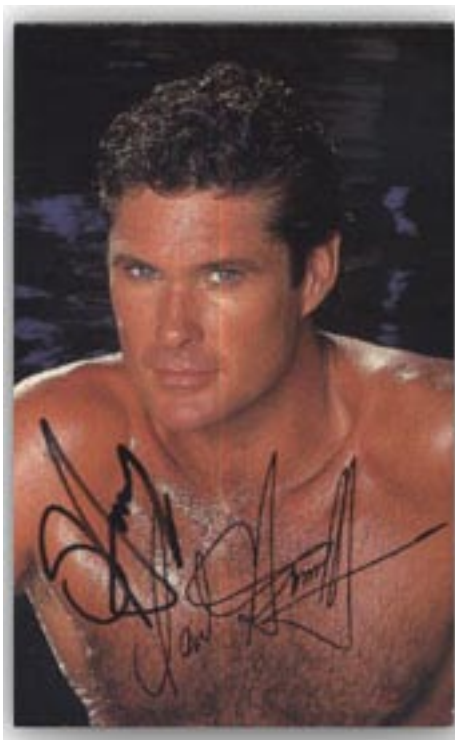
29. David Hasselhoff. (Born 1952). American actor, singer, producer and businessman. He is best known for his lead role as L. A. County Lifeguard Mitch Buchannon in the series *Baywatch*. In 2007 a home video clip surfaced of Hasselhoff apparently in a drunken stupor. The video showed him shirtless, lying on the floor, drunkenly trying to consume a cheeseburger in a Las Vegas hotel room. On May 26, 2010, he was rushed to hospital following a three-day drinking binge. 3.5x5.5 vintage photo of a shirtless Hasselhoff signed in black felt pen above facsimile signature. Verso contains promo for *Baywatch*. In very good condition.

28. Huntz Hall. (1920-1998). American actor. For over 20 years he played the slow-witted sidekick of Leo Gorcey in more than 80 *Bowery Boys* and *Dead End Kids* movies. 8x10 sepia photo, signed and

inscribed in black ink, "To Pee Wee a swell guy Sincerely Huntz Hall." Pinholes, small tears and creasing along margins. Signature and inscription very lightly rubbed.

30. Helen Hayes. (1900-1993). Known as "first lady" of the American stage. Academy Award winner. Hayes made most of her infrequent film appearances after an

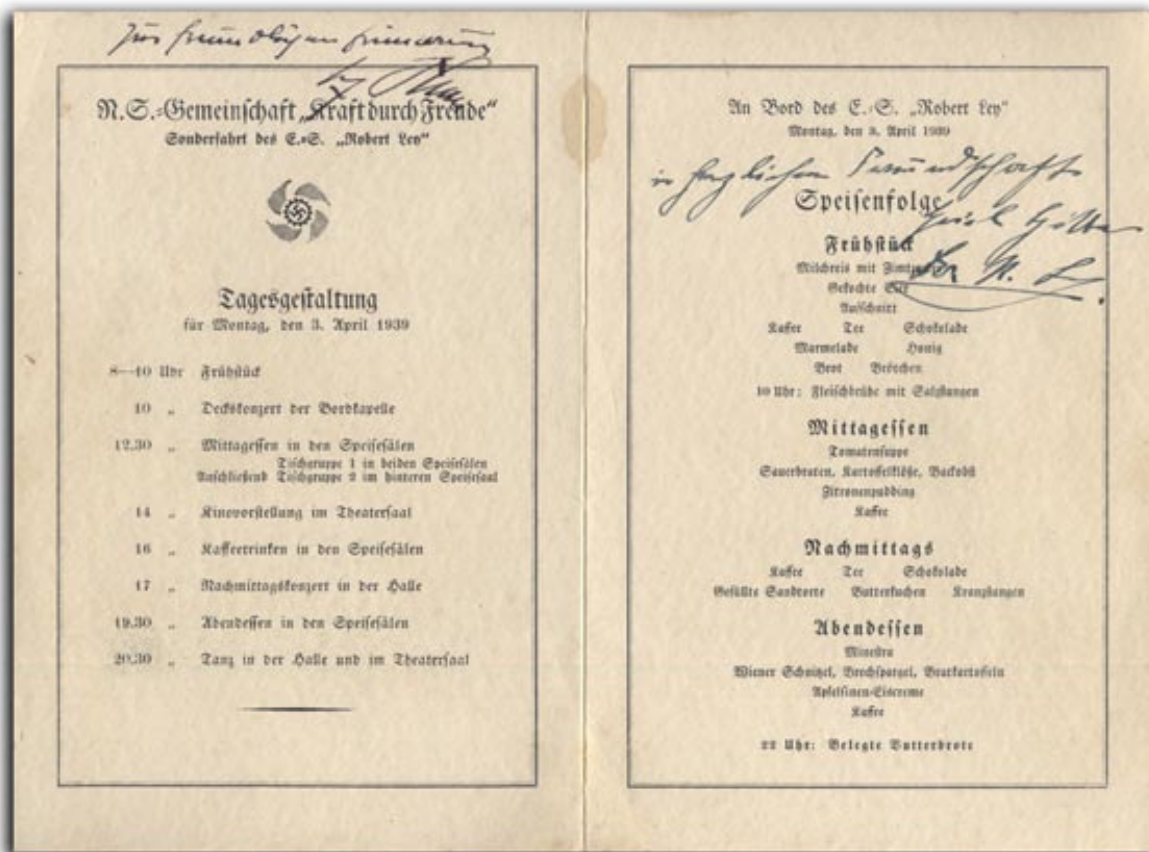
allergy to theater dust forced her to retire from the stage. Her stage career began when she was five; at age nine, she made her first Broadway appearance. By 1918, she was a star. She won her first Oscar for *The Sin of Madelon Claudet* (1931). Original 7x9.5 playbill from the 1938 production of *Victoria Regina* at the Martin Beck Theatre. Black ink signature on cover. Light wear and soiling to cover.

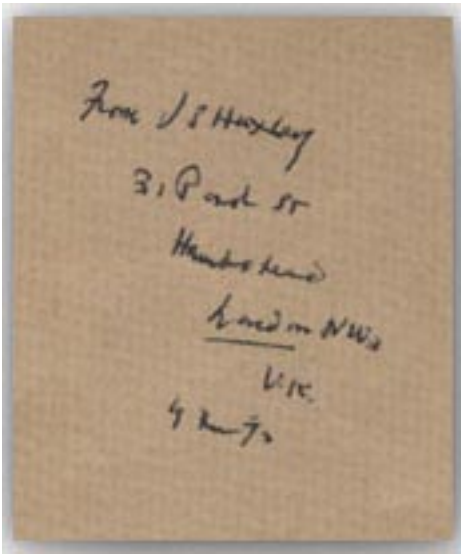
31. Mariel Hemingway. (Born 1961). American actress, athlete, writer and sister of Margaux and grand-daughter of Ernest Hemingway. Gave a memorable performance as a teenager in *Personal Best*. 8x10 glamor photo of a bejewelled Hemingway signed and inscribed in black felt pen, "Heather. Mariel Hemingway." In very good condition.

32. Adolf Hitler and Robert Ley. Hitler. (1889-1945). German politician and Führer. His one-thousand year Reich lasted only 12 years, but long enough for him to have been responsible for the murder or death of over 12 million people, including six million Jews subjected to the “final solution.” Ley. (1890-1945). Nazi politician and head of the German Labour Front from 1933 to 1945. He committed suicide while awaiting trial for war crimes. 5x7.5 two-page ship’s program, listing the menus and daily activities for April 3, 1939, aboard the liner Robert Ley. Cover bears a color image of the ship, with a printed message that the cruise is offered to all German workers through the Strength Through Joy program. Inside bears a list of events for the day aboard the ship, including deck concerts, a movie and dance, and lists the menu for the day. Signed in black ink at the top of the left-hand page, in German, “in happy remembrance, Adolf Hitler,” and signed in blue ink on the facing page, also in German, “in devoted friendship, Leirl Gotta, from R. Ley.” Hitler and Ley were aware that their suppression of the trade unions in the 1930s, coupled with demands for increased productivity in the workplace, created a risk of working-class discontent. To ward off potential problems, Ley’s organization established a state-controlled leisure organization, Strength Through Joy, to provide various benefits to German workers and their families, with the aforementioned cruise ship, christened after Ley, constructed to take members on Mediterranean cruises. A bizarre artifact on the eve of world conflict. The history of the Robert Ley: The Robert Ley and her older sister-ship Wilhelm Gustloff would go down in history as the first purpose-built cruise ships ever. Unlike every other ship built at the time, the two new Germans’ passenger accommodations were not divided into separate classes. Passengers and the crew members were given the same kind of cabins. Equality had for the first time reached the high seas, ironically in a Nazi ship. The Robert Ley was managed by the Hamburg-Amerika Line, although she was technically owned by the DAF (German labor front). The Robert Ley served as a Kdf (Strength Through Joy) cruise ship for about two months, but was called in for other duties in May of 1939. A week before the beginning of WWII, the Robert Ley was commissioned and converted into a hospital ship for the German Kriegsmarine on August 25, 1939. When the Poland campaign had been won, the Robert Ley was decommissioned from her hospital duties on November 22nd. She was now instead sent to Neustadt, where she would serve mostly as an accommodation ship, transporting sick and wounded German soldiers. On March 9, 1945, the British Royal Air Force bombed the Robert Ley. All that was left of the Robert Ley was a burned-out hulk. It was not until two years after the war that the Robert Ley was towed to Great Britain for scrapping, in 1947. Provenance: Includes copy of COA from R&R Enterprises. I have extensively researched this item and have consulted with two experts and am totally convinced this is authentic. I found on the internet an image of Hitler aboard the Robert Ley liner on April 3, 1939 and include a scan in this entry. This item was owned by a close friend and customer of mine for over 20 years. He purchased the menu about ten years ago, paying much more than the current minimum bid. He died over a year ago, leaving behind one of the finest autograph collections I have ever seen.
